that it is appointed unto man once to die do make this
as my last Will and Testament revoking all others
in like manner and following to wit
1st to my dear and beloved wife Catharine Hagler I
will and bequeath my Farm on which I now live and
as much of the personal property as she may wish to keep
for her support and all the money on hand after paying
all my burial expenses and last claims against me
2nd if there should be any personal property that my wife
does not know or wish to keep for her support ^{my} it is my wish
that my Children shall have an equal division of said
property & they may divide the property or have it sold and
divide the proceeds equal between them, and at the
death of my wife all the property both real & Personal
to be equally ^{divided} between my Children,
3rd if my wife Catharine should ever change her name
it is my wish that she shall have her dower & the
remainder be equally divided amongst my children
4th I do hereby constitute and appoint my son
William Hagler Executor of this my last will
and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 13th day of April A.D. 1850
